<b>Boarding Away From Home Allowance (BAHA)</b> (State)	Eligible to families that permanently reside in WA and qualify for the AIC Basic Boarding Allowance	Primary & Secondary	\$1,350 per year
<b>Student Travel Subsidy Scheme (STSS)</b> (State)	*Students must be dependent upon their parents/guardian and not working full time *Not receiving Youth Allowance or Abstudy payments; and *Have both parents or sole parent living within the Defined Remote Area (DRA) *Applications must be submitted one month prior to travel	Primary, Secondary & Tertiary up to 26	Primary & Secondary students receive 4 return trips per school year.  Tertiary students receive up to 4 return trips depending on year of study.  SIDE students receive up to 3 return trips per school year depending on year of study.
<b>Road Travel Subsidy (RTS)</b> (State)	*At least 56km from home to the nearest appropriate Govt school with boarding facilities <b>OR</b> regular passenger transport (bus depot, airport) *Can claim up to 8 round trips per school year *Should only be claimed once at the end of the school year when all travel has been undertaken	Primary, Secondary & Tertiary	25.24 cents p/km per round trip after 112km (56km x 2)
<b>Conveyance Allowance</b> (State)	*Reside more than 4.5km from the nearest appropriate Government school; <b>OR</b> *Required to travel more than 4.5km from home to the nearest School Bus Stop *Reside outside the designated Public Transport Area	Primary & Secondary	25.24 cents p/km

<b>Student Start-Up Loan</b>	Available to all Youth Allowance recipients Loan periods are 1 Jan to 30 Jun and 1 Jul to 31 Dec each year	Tertiary	\$1,201 up to twice per year
<b>Relocation Scholarship</b>	Eligibility is assess based on receipt of other payments e.g. Dependent Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY Living Allowance Recipients who need to live away from home to study		\$5,080 1st year \$2,541 2nd year \$1,269 3rd and following years
<b>Fares Allowance</b> (Federal)	Available to eligible Youth Allowance, Austudy or ABSTUDY recipients only who are enrolled in either On Campus or External Tertiary Studies.	Full time Tertiary	Up to 2 return trips per study year
<b>Living Away from Home Allowance</b> (Federal)	Available to eligible young people who have to move away from home to take up or continue with an apprenticeship or traineeship.  Not available if claiming Youth Allowance.	Full time or part-time apprentices or school based apprentices	1st year \$77.17 2nd year \$38.50 3rd year \$25 per week
<b>Tertiary Access Payment (TAP)</b> (Federal)	* An inner regional, outer regional or remote student. * Relocating at least 90 mins from family home by public transport to commence a full-time higher-level tertiary education (Certificate IV or above) * Commencing study immediately following completion of year 12 or equivalent	Tertiary Post Compulsory schooling	Up to \$5,000 in 2 installments \$5,000 for outer regional, remote and very remote students \$3,000 for inner regional
<b>ABSTUDY</b>	Must be Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander Australian in an approved course, Australian apprenticeship or traineeship Must not be getting another payment to study or train	Primary/Secondary Tertiary Post Compulsory schooling	Rates vary
<b>Austudy</b>	* 25 years or older * Student studying full-time or undertaking a full-time apprenticeship or traineeship * Income and asset means tested	Tertiary Post Compulsory schooling	Rates vary
