Your role

- Development of media releases and communicating newsworthy items to various media contacts.
- Support Federal Council with media/publicity obligations. It is important that the Publicity Officer is available for media contact especially during major announcements. It is desirable that the Publicity Officer manages all media requests and develops relationships with key supporting journalists.
- Look for opportunities to promote the organisation positively.
- Encourage other Federal Councillors to participate in publicity opportunities e.g. photos from State Conferences and meetings.
- Collate, with the assistance of portfolio leaders, the quarterly ICPA (Aust) enewsletter the Federal Focus.
- Participate in strategic and operational planning and activities.
- Take part in Federal Council monthly meetings, ensuring the publicity needs of the organisation are heard and that the best interests of the Council and its purpose are upheld.
- Travel with Federal Council representative events e.g. Delegations, Federal Conference (approx. 3 weeks/year).
