

So, what is a Branch Mentor?

Queensland State Councillors take on the role of Branch Mentor to several branches each year, but what does this involve? The Queensland Constitution which governs ICPA Qld allows for Queensland State Council to have general control of Branches within Queensland – branch mentors facilitate communication between Branches and State Council and are in place to ensure that any issue or confusion which arises can be resolved quickly.

Your branch mentor will:

- ❖ Provide you with up-to-date information around State Council happenings and at times request information from your branch
- ❖ Be available to your Branch for advice regarding policies and procedure
- ❖ Liaise with Branch Executives where State Council advice is requested
- ❖ Assist your Branch in the lead up to State Conference with motion wording and feedback

To assist your Branch Mentor, you can:

- ❖ Ensure your Branch Mentor is included in all branch communications – just add them to your mailing list
- ❖ Keep your Branch Mentor up to date with any of your local issues relating to rural and remote education
- ❖ Forward any Branch Mentor communication around to all your Branch Members when received
