CURRICULUM 2008

POLICY:

ICPA seeks to ensure that students from rural and remote areas are provided with access to a quality, quantity and diversity of curriculum sufficient to effect an equal opportunity with their non-isolated counterparts.

OBJECTIVES:

1. That the Commonwealth and South Australian Governments establish responsibilities in the field of Distance Education.

- 2. That the South Australian Government recognise and act upon the need for availability of funds in the development, production and distribution of curriculum materials, including new technology.
- 3. That responsibility for developing courses be assumed by those who have a working knowledge of the needs and aspirations of the geographically isolated student, parent and supervisor.
- 4. That input from experienced home supervisors be considered an integral part of curriculum development for distance education courses.
- 5. That the attainment of basic oracy, literacy, numeracy and computer literacy be regarded as essential to all students, regardless of location.
- 6. That the need for development of parts of the curriculum with appropriate local orientation be drawn to the attention of the South Australian Education Department.
- 7. That special purpose funding continue to aid in the expansion of programmes to give greater social and cultural opportunities.
- 8. That children at all levels of schooling suffer no difficulties or disadvantages on transferring between curricula for distance education and urban education.
- 9. That all children with specific needs be considered in curriculum development.
- 10. That curricula be such that isolated students can be absorbed into trade, employment and tertiary education on an equal footing with their non-isolated peers.
- 11. That a national curriculum, at both primary and secondary levels, be introduced.
- 12. That the South Australian Schools of Distance Education access interstate distance education materials where appropriate.
